Veterinary History Society

This society was founded at an inaugural meeting held in the Wellcome Historical Medical Library in London on 31st October 1962.

The aims of the society are to foster all aspects of veterinary history by means of: promoting meetings, publishing a regular journal (*Veterinary History*), preparing exhibitions, sponsoring lectures and prizes for students, sponsoring lectures for other veterinary associations and holding joint meetings with other societies, encouraging the preservation of artefacts of veterinary historical interest and assisting research workers and others on any matter related to the history of the veterinary art.

Meetings are held two or three times a year, often in London, but the summer meeting is usually held elsewhere and can take the form of a weekend break. There have also been overseas trips to European veterinary university cities.

Veterinary History is published twice yearly and is received by all members and subscribing libraries. A regular newsletter is also sent to members.

Membership is open to all and not confined to veterinary surgeons. All members are encouraged to participate in the society's activities. Assistance is always welcome on the committee and by the presentation of suitable lectures or contributions to *Veterinary History*.
